

Anxiety in Adolescents and Children:

Information for Teachers and Parents – Dan Weinstein, Psy.D.

The purpose of this presentation is to provide current, evidence-based information about anxiety disorders in children and adolescents. Dr. Weinstein will review the prevalence, triggers, developmental course, and causal factors with regard to clinical anxiety. Co-occurrence and overlap of anxiety symptoms with other disorders will be discussed (e.g., depression, AD/HD).

Dr. Weinstein will describe the various types of anxiety disorders, including their signs, symptoms, and how they manifest in children and adolescents. He will provide recommendations for how to help students with clinical anxiety, and will discuss which effective treatments are available for children and adolescents suffering from anxiety.
